

Southmead has a wealth of fascinating history that we would like to uncover with the help of local residents.

Southmead was created in the 1930s when people were moved from all over Bristol to 1,500 newly built houses.

From September 2016 to July 2017 we will be working with:

- Bristol University and innovative film and media production company, Calling the Shots to create a documentary that captures the history of the neighbourhood and the houses in which you grew up
- Inspirational cookery company, Travelling Kitchen to cook meals together and see what we can learn from recipes from the 1930s about healthy eating today
- Bristol Old Vic theatre company to produce a 'soap opera' about the beginnings of Southmead that will be performed by you, live in the streets in July 2017
- Multi-media producer, Tot Foster to create an exhibition based on objects that you provide that reveal something about Southmead's history
